JOURNAL ENTRY REQUIRMENTS:

Incoming 2nd graders: 5-10 MINUTES, which should be 1-2 good sentences, e.g. "Today, I rode my bike to the park." or "I went to the park. I played with Joey."

Incoming 3rd graders: 10-15 MINUTES which should be 5-8 good sentences, e.g., "Today, I rode my bike to the park. My friend Sally was with me. We played on the swings. We had a picnic. Later in the afternoon we went swimming. I practiced my diving."

Incoming 4th graders: 15-20 MINUTES which should be 1-2 paragraphs with topic sentence & supporting sentences. Example paragraph: "Yesterday was the worst day of my summer break so far. First, my brother woke me up at 4:00 in the morning, and I couldn't get back to sleep. Then my friend Jessica called to say she couldn't come over to play. We were going to watch a movie together. And for dinner, my mom made a new chicken dish and it tasted so bad, I had to spit it out. I hope the rest of summer is better than this."

Incoming 5th graders: 20-25 MINUTES which should be 2-3 paragraphs with topic sentence & supporting sentences. See example under "incoming 4th graders".
